

US Figure Skating Learn to Skate Levels

All new sign-ups must pay a \$20.00 US Basic Skills registration fee, Valid from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. This fee is included into the price of the Learn to Skate Winter Class session

All new sign-ups must pay a \$20.00 Learn to Skate USA membership, valid from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021. This fee is included into the price of the Learn to Skate Winter Class session.

With your annual fee you will:

- Be a member of the best skating program endorsed by U.S. Figure Skating, USA Hockey and US Speed skating.
- Gain great information to make sure your first glides on ice are successful ones.
- Access full listings of where and when to sign up for skating classes.
- Receive a Welcome Packet in the mail, which includes a subscription to Learn To Skate USA The Magazine valued at \$3 (*allow 2-4 weeks for delivery*)
- Receive secondary sport accident insurance

The *Basic Skills* program is designed by the USFSA to help the skater learn all the fundamentals of figure skating and hockey. The registration fee includes sport accident insurance for the skater, a record book, and badges. After completion of a skill level the skater will also receive a certificate. The program is divided into the following levels: *Snowplow Sam* ages 5 & under, *Basic Skills* ages 7 to adult, *Free Skate*, and *Ice Dance*.
The Ice Vault will only be giving Learn to Skate classes to ages 6 to 14 at this time. No tots.

Learn to Skate USA offers a standardized curriculum designed to help skaters of all ages and abilities master the basics of ice skating. With specially formulated pathways, kids, adults and skaters with disabilities, the Learn to Skate USA curriculum ensures that everyone can learn how to ice skate.

BASIC 4 & 5 – Must be approved by the Learn to Skate Director.
